VICARIOUS TRAUMA AND COMPASSION FATIGUE

As trauma helpers we are exposed to our clients' trauma material on a regular basis. A conceivable result of this work is vicarious traumatization. The changes experienced by the trauma helpers parallel those experienced by trauma survivors. Vicarious traumatization (VT) may result from working directly with trauma survivors or perpetrators of violence, or indirectly through exposure to graphic descriptions of violence or victimization, in supervision, sessions, readings or professional presentations (Pearlman, 1993). VT may be considered an occupational hazard – a consequence of empathy, and trauma helpers may begin to view the world through a trauma lens. This workshop focuses on developing a protective layer of self-care while remaining emotionally available to clients.
